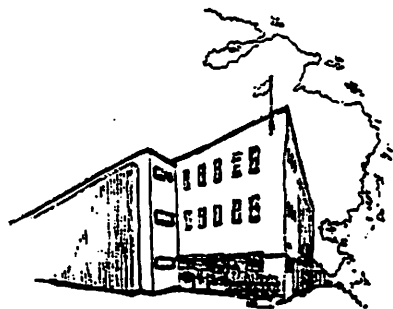

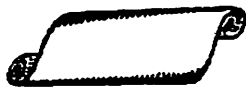
Visitors in Town

95 Economic Outlook
& Investment Strategy

九五經濟展望及 投資策略

筆者相信九五年對投資界來說，應該是健康的好的一年。筆者預計美國的中央銀行利率在九五年會增加百份之一，而經濟會保持較九四年溫和的增長。另外，全球經濟大部會向好，其中西歐及日本會真正擺脫過往幾年的衰退，經濟環境大幅改善。加拿大亦會成為這個復甦期的得益者，其中尤以天然資源、金屬、木材及出口業最為受惠。

世界金融市場在九四年經歷了多次沖擊，美國六次加息，令到九三年締造的美好投資光景突然轉得灰暗。九四年世界大部分証券市場，不論是債券或股票都向下回落，其中尤以東南亞市場及拉丁美洲市跌幅最為厲害。

令到很多較新進入投資市場的投資者驚訝地發覺及感受到投資的風險，繼而慌忙迴避，不敢再踏足這個變幻莫測的金融圈。

但是筆者認為九四年的投資損失，對很多人來說都不會是太壞的，因為這樣也可以重新提高一般投資者的警覺性，而且可以令真正的投資者在未來的幾年間得到一個較為健康的市場氣候，從而獲得更穩健的回報。

美國繼九四年六次加息而再在今年二月一日加息半厘，讀者相信這不單止不會為這次全球經濟復甦帶來壞影響，反而會有助穩定及延長這個復甦周期，不致重蹈八十年代經濟過熱的覆轍。在這樣的情況下，美國股票市場顯然會擺脫加息的陰影，而隨著公司營利的大幅增長而向上揚升。西歐市場亦隨著經濟大幅復甦而再次暢旺，日本雖然經歷地震的恐慌，但筆者有信心日本股票市場會是這個龐大重建關頭的受惠者。新興市場的東南亞及拉丁美洲，經過九四年的大幅調整後，筆者相信現時已是趁低吸納的好時機，不過亦要藉此忠告各位切勿博到盡，因為這些市場的波幅始終非常大。
