I wish you enough gain to satisfy your wanting. I wish you enough loss to appreciate all that you possess. I wish you enough hellos to get you through the final good-bye.

She then began to cry and walked away. It takes a minute to find a special person, an hour to appreciate them, a day to love them, but then an entire life to forget them. *TAKE TIME TO LIVE*

Mr. Arthur Hinton - an honorary doctorate, 2004, Hong Kong Institute of Education

Twenty-five years after Mr. Arthur Hinton left Hong Kong, he returned to attend the Golden Jubilee Celebration of QES (Queen Elizabeth School). QES was where Mr. Hinton began as the founding senior master in 1954, and then the principal in 1959, before leaving in 1967 to become principal of Northcote College, the fore-runner of the Hong Kong Institute of Education (HKIEd).

On each of Mr. Arthur's trips to HK, he is welcomed by hundreds of QES alumni, who remember Mr. Hinton fondly as a teacher who inspires his students through compassion, empathy, reasoning and one who led by example. Many QES alumni became movershakers in business and the government in Hong Kong and overseas. On his most recent trip, Mr. Hinton's dedication and contribution was recognized by being conferred an honorary doctorate from the Hong Kong Institute of Education.

While Mr. Hinton acknowledged that the Hong Kong education system in the sixties and seventies was a rigid system, and it was not uncommon for school principals to cane boys for minor infringements, infractions against code of conduct in schools, such as rolling up their shirt sleeves, Mr. Hinton refused to conform, and instead fostered a friendly approach with students, one that focuses on nurturing responsibility and self-discipline rather than rules and punishment. "The accent was more on the positive praising of good behaviour," remarked Mr. Hinton to the interviewer.

Working together with the then principal, Cheong Wai-fung, Mr. Hinton helped build a school that became known for the opportunities it gave its students in extra-curricular activities, community involvement and academic excellence. QES was soon revered as the best school in Hong Kong.

A unique experience that former QES students still remember fondly is the outward bound camp at Tsam Chuk Wan, Saikung, that was initiated by Mr. Hinton. Interestingly, the most active alumni members presently were former camp wardens. Mr. Hinton suggested that "they developed very well as people able to take responsibility." Even today, QES is the only school in Hong Kong to have such a facility.

In 1967, Mr. Hinton was transferred to become principal of Northcote College. Mr. Hinton became a founding committee member of the Professional Teachers' Union and supported their fight against a pay cut for new teachers.

HKIEd's citation of Mr. Hinton achievements suggested that his readiness to speak out was speculated to be a primary reason why he was never appointed Director of Education, as he was perceived to be a radical. Mr. Hinton was a proponent of instructions in students' mother tongue, due to students' lack of total comprehension of the English language. Mr. Hinton wrote an article for the University of Hong Kong's Journal of Education on this subject. However, the article was never published due to its perceived radical proposal.

The degree to which QES alumni value their experience and are galvanized to give back to their community can be witnessed in the establishment of QES Old Students' Association Schools in Hong Kong – one secondary school, two primary schools and a kindergarten, with another secondary school scheduled to open in 2005.

Since Mr. Hinton's retirement from teaching, and his departure from Hong Kong 25 years ago, he has immersed himself in volunteer work for various Quaker and United Nations organizations.

Mr. Hinton recently completed his autobiography titled "Only a Teacher", published by York University, Toronto, and the Hong Kong Institute of Education. One of the central themes of the book suggests that "the key to good education lies in the heart of the teacher." Dr. Hinton most certainly exemplifies this principle.

- 1944 married Hedy Langer, who had escaped from Nazi Vienna in 1939
- 1948 completed teacher's training at Bristol, England
- 1949 joined Colonial Office as a teacher in Malaya
- 1953 teacher of King George V School and then King's College, Hong Kong
- 1954 founding senior master of Queen Elizabeth School, Hong Kong
- 1959 principal of Queen Elizabeth School, Hong Kong
- 1967 principal of Northcote College of Education, Hong Kong
- 1974 senior lecturer, School of Education, Chinese University of Hong Kong
- 1980 retired from CUHK, moved to Hedy's home city of Vienna
- 2004 published autobiography and received honorary doctorate degree
